Toplines: Minnesota Survey on Trump's Immigration Policies

This survey of 800 Minnesota adults was designed by Wave Polling and Research, LLC and conducted online from February 6 to February 10, 2026 by Verasight, a mixed-mode survey provider. The margin of sampling error is ± 3.5 percentage points. Results below show overall weighted percentages for the full Minnesota sample alongside results for the Twin Cities (Minneapolis–Saint Paul metro, n=491) using MSA-specific weights.

2024 Trump voter classification: Trump defectors are 2024 Trump voters who now say they would vote for a Democrat in Congress or are undecided. Loyal Trump voters are 2024 Trump voters who still intend to vote Republican.
