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Survey overview

Methodology

- **1,500 US adults**, Feb 6–10, 2026
- Online via Verasight
- Margin of error: ± 2.5 pp

Key findings at a glance

1. **Trump's coalition is fracturing:** ~14% of 2024 Trump voters have defected
2. **Wrong priorities:** 69% say the administration focuses too much on deportations
3. **Immigration enforcement hurts the GOP:** Pushes more voters away; 51% view GOP less favorably
4. **Why Trump voters are leaving:** Immigration is a top-3 driver of defection
5. **Path to citizenship:** 72% support a path to citizenship

Finding 1: Trump's coalition is fracturing

~14%

of 2024 Trump voters have defected

(now say they'll vote Democratic or are undecided)

Finding 2: Wrong priorities

69%

say the administration focuses too much on deportations
and not enough on the economy

Trump defectors	77%

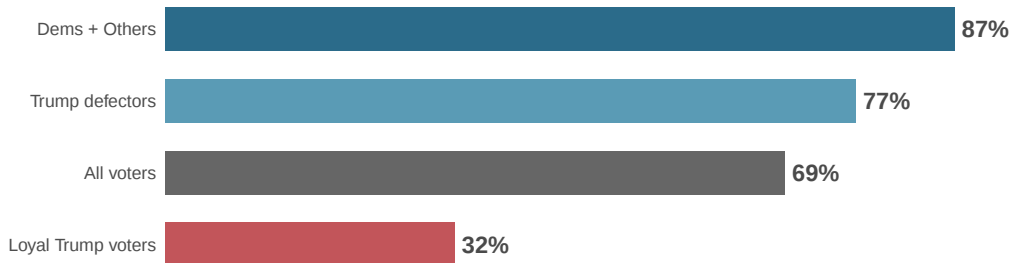

Finding 2: “Too focused on deportations”

Finding 3: Immigration enforcement is hurting the GOP

Enforcement pushes voters away

- **35%** say enforcement makes them *less likely* to vote Republican vs. 26% more likely
- **35%** say ICE deployments make them *less likely* vs. 25% more likely
- Only **40%** approve of handling of deportations; **57%** disapprove

GOP image has deteriorated

51% view the Republican Party *less favorably* than a year ago (vs. only 17% more favorably)

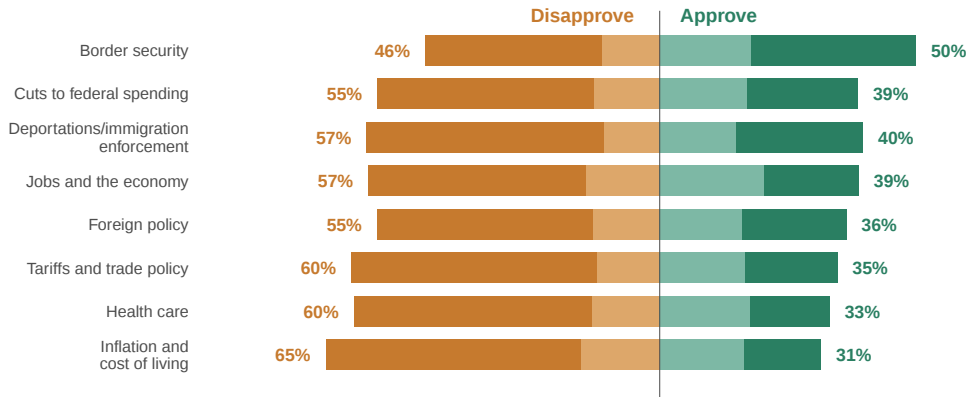
33% would view Dems more favorably if leaders pressed to reduce ICE deployments (vs. 20% less)

Finding 3: Approval of Trump admin handling of issues

All respondents | Darker shade = stronger opinion

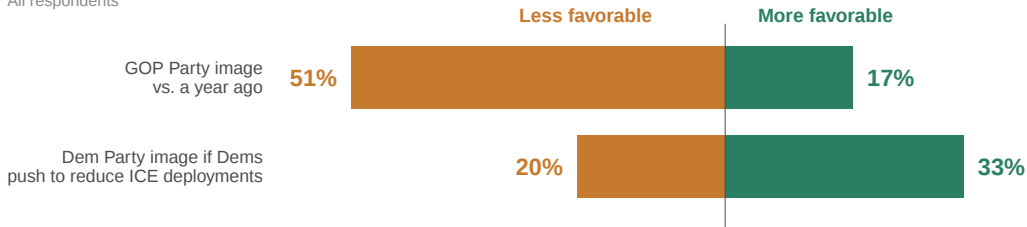


Q: Do you approve or disapprove of the way the Trump administration is handling each of the following?

All respondents



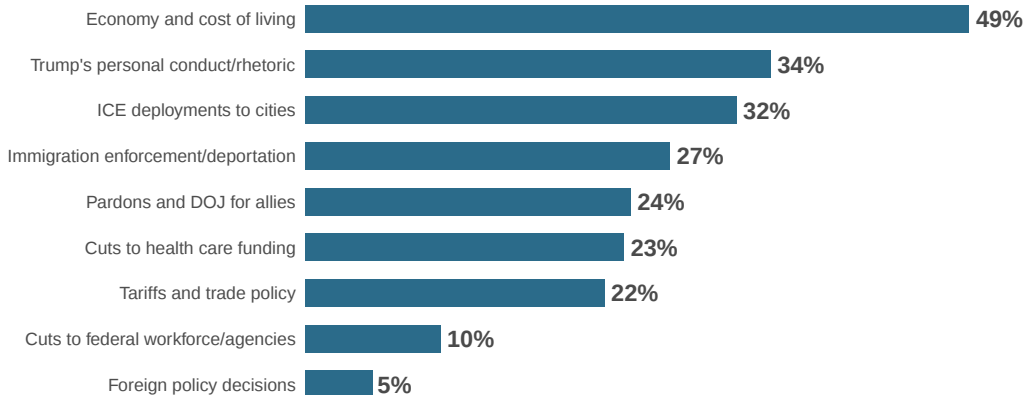
Q: Compared to a year ago, is your opinion of the Republican Party more favorable, less favorable, or about the same?

Finding 5: Large majorities support a path to citizenship

72%

support a path to **citizenship**

(44% strongly)

71%

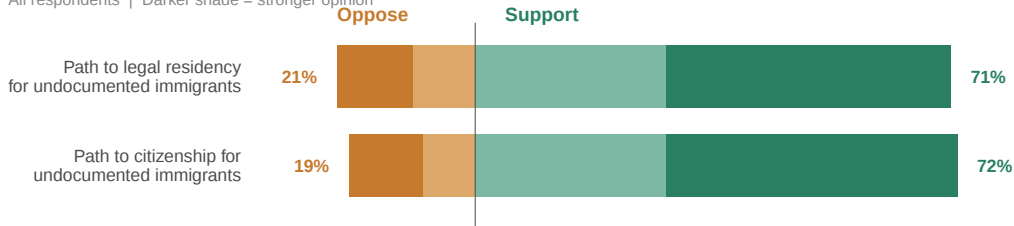
support a path to **legal residency**

Finding 5: Broad support for a path to citizenship

Strategic implications for 2026

Immigration enforcement is a vulnerability for Republicans

- Net **-9 points**: enforcement makes more voters *less* likely to vote Republican than more likely
- ~14% of Trump's 2024 coalition has defected; immigration is a top driver
- Democrats lead the generic ballot 51-40

A two-front strategy: immigration + economics

- Anti-deportation messaging is compatible with economic messaging, not a substitute
- Voters' #1 issue is inflation/cost of living; 69% say admin is too focused on deportations
- Candidates leave votes on the table if either front is missing

Pro-immigrant positions are popular

- Paths to citizenship (72%) and legal residency (71%) have supermajority support
- Opposing ICE deployments is a net positive for Democratic favorability (+13 points)
